Can you find a foxglove taller than you are?
Can you find any other pink flowers?

Wild Raspberries



Can you see any raspberry flowers or have the fruit developed and ripened?

Marker Posts



How many posts with just a white band can you find?



This is a Ringlet, how many can you find?
Can you see any other butterflies?

Grasses



There are lots of different grasses to be found around the paths. These pictures show some of their flowers. How many different ones can you find?




Remember that the heads change from green to brown as the seeds develop and ripen.

Mountain Ash (Rowan)



How many leaflets can you find on one leaf?

Hawthorn



Be careful, its twigs have spikes or thorns along them - hence its name!

Scots Pine



These leaves are called needles, they are sharp, grow in pairs and are about 5cm long.

Geese



Lots of geese come here to moult and grow new wing feathers, this is a Canada goose can you see any around the reservoir?

There are lots of greylag geese as well.

Dragonflies and Damselflies



How many dragonflies and damselflies can you count?

Dragonflies can fly straight up and down and side to side.



If it's a warm day and you'd like to see lots of dragonflies and damselflies head to the hub and check the pools by the centre.
