Hannah can advise on woodland and hedgerow creation at all scales, site visits available for woodland creation that is a minimum of 0.5ha in total (can be split across different areas of the farm). She can complete constraints checks on behalf of landowners including on priority habitats present, breeding bird suitability, archaeology, peaty soils and other ecologically important areas. Hannah can also help in decision making over most appropriate grants and funding available for woodland and hedgerow creation and complete site designs and species mixes for sites suitable for Woodland Trust funding.

The Farming Community Network run a confidential helpline which is open every day of the year 7am - 11pm with volunteers providing free, confidential, pastoral and practical support to anyone within the farming community. Their volunteers, many of whom are involved in farming, or have close links with agriculture, have a great understanding of the issues that farmers, farm workers and farming families regularly face. They can offer a wide range of support from help with paperwork, to acting as family mediators, and even supporting farmers through legal issues — or you might just need someone to listen. This is a fantastic voluntary organisation and charity that supports farmers and families within the farming community through difficult times.

Field Nurse is a small charity supporting healthcare in rural areas. They provide 'drop-in' medical clinics at local auction marts, offering health advice and basic checks such as blood pressure, and a friendly face to chat to for anyone struggling with their mental health or just feeling lonely.
