Size and Landscape



- ➋ Ponds, hedgerows, woodland and riverstreams

Activities Available

- Ⓐ Activity and discovery farm walks with farmer
- Ⓐ Dairy processing – make cheese, yoghurt, butter
- Ⓐ Gate to Plate – farm animals in the food chain
- Ⓐ Interaction with pigs, dairy cows and sheep
- Ⓐ Art & Craft – collect, design and produce nature boards
- Ⓐ History – Roman to medieval farming and landscapes



Brief History

- Ⓐ The farmhouse dates from 1580 and the barn 1720 and has been connected to the Robinson family for 500 years
- Ⓐ A roman road passes close by. Some field patterns date from the Middle Ages (ridge & furrow). Old artefacts and coins have been found



Conservation on the Farm

- Ⓐ Natural and organically farmed land and livestock; led by nature, not consumer demand

- Ⓐ We are restoring the wild flower meadows, and cut traditional small bale hay later in year
- Ⓐ We are also improving habitats for breeding wading birds and woodland, hedgerow birds



Farm Walks

- Ⓐ There are a range of themed, discovery/activity farmer-led walks available
- Ⓐ Terrain and distances are gentle and suitable for KS1 upwards



Farm Projects

- Ⓐ Organic pork, lamb, beef, milk and cheese are processed on the farm and available directly to the public through a farm shop which also doubles as a butchers (cutting facility)
- Ⓐ Lower Gazegill attends farmers' markets across the region and delivers 'meat boxes' to the public and retail/restaurant trade
